Dear FOC Church Family,

We are excited to finally meet together again for worship! We want to welcome you all back in the safest and most comfortable way that we can. That said, it will be tough to beat the comfort of your own home! We encourage you to read through this article a couple times to catch all the information:

First, let me begin by asking you to be "full of grace" and loving as we begin the process of reopening. It would be easy for a time like this to divide us, so please be kind and understanding in this process. For some, it will seem too slow and can create frustration. For others, it will seem too fast and reckless. We want to speak to any and all concerns.

Second, this is our "plan," which is to say, there could be events that impact our planned reopening or in the coming months, could make us shut down again. The most obvious example would be if the virus "rebounds" and there are many infected and dying. We will adjust and adapt as best as we can!

If you make the decision that you do not feel comfortable attending, we completely understand. We are thankful that our services will continue to livestream at both 8:00 am and 10:15 am, and we respect you wanting to stay home for the time being. Obviously, if you feel ill or have risk factors that make you more vulnerable, please stay home.

If you are anxious to get back into church and worship, here is the scoop!

WHAT WE ARE DOING TO KEEP YOU SAFE

- 1) We are reopening the Worship Center ONLY. This is limited to the 8:00 am Classic service and the 10:15 am Modern service. We will not be able to offer Nursery childcare or Children's Church initially.
- 2) The doors to the Worship Center will be propped open, so that no one has to touch the door and air can circulate better throughout the space.
- 3) We have seats spaced out in the Worship Center, so you are always at least six feet away from the next closest family. Please do not move the seats!
- 4) We will not be passing plates for offerings, but rather encourage you to "drop" it in the baskets on the way in or out of worship. There will be several around the worship area.
- 5) We ask that you pick up Communion on the way in! We will give those instructions in worship.
- 6) We will be cleaning the chairs between the services each week. We will also clean them during the week.
- 7) We will be cleaning the bathrooms as best we can between services.
- 8) There will be no passing of the peace, hand shaking, etc. for the time being.

WHAT WE ARE ASKING OF YOU

- 9) **In order to attend worship, we ask that you follow a special link to "reserve" your spot. This link will be emailed each week and will also be posted on our website.** Please make sure you put the correct number of your family that will be attending! If you don't make a reservation, we CANNOT guarantee your seat. We only have a certain number of seats, so it is important that you follow this step.
- 10) We ask that you come early (10 minutes or earlier) to be seated. We will have Greeters meet you at the door and escort you and your family to your seats. A Greeter will also escort you out of the service once it is over. We are doing this in an effort to keep everyone safe and control the flow.
- 11) We ask that you wear a mask when you are inside the Worship Center. Studies suggest that the airborne nature of the virus is the most dangerous. If you have a child 5 or older, we recommend they wear a mask, but we understand that can be difficult, so we will be full of grace on those situations.
- 12) We ask that if you'd like to fellowship and talk with people, please do this outside in the parking lots. It is better to do that out in the fresh air and where you can get away from the crowd.

That is a lot to take in! I hope that this announcement brings you both clarity and joy. It has been several weeks, but I believe that we have a great plan. Please know this is a temporary plan - one designed to get us back to a "new normal." During this transition time, we will find things that we need to change or do a better job on. I encourage you to reach out to me or to your Elder to make suggestions on how we can improve. We will do the best we can to incorporate those suggestions but cannot promise to implement them all.

On behalf of our amazing Staff, as well as our gifted congregational Leaders, I want to thank you for your incredible support for our church. I also want to thank you for being "full of grace" and patient as we navigate this new season. Blessings on your day, and I looking forward to seeing you on Sunday mornings!

Psalms of Ascent

Did you know there is a road trip "playlist" in the Bible? Psalms is a book in the Old Testament filled with 150 songs that God's people have been praying and singing for thousands of years. Within this book there is a particular set of Psalms that form a smaller collection that was used by God's people as they traveled.

This playlist is called the "Psalms of Ascent." It is a collection of 15 songs — Psalms 120-134. God's people would sing them as they traveled to Jerusalem for religious events and festivals. Traveling to Jerusalem was a BIG deal for them, and the "Psalms of Ascent" were a special part of this trip. Why are these called the Psalms of "Ascent"?

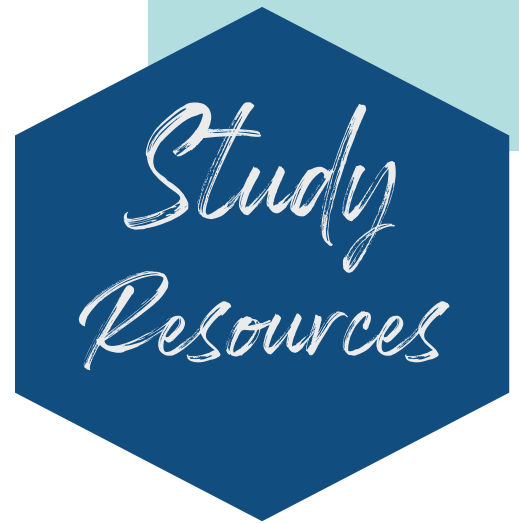
When you ascend, you go up. As God's people traveled to Jerusalem, regardless of their geographic position, they were always traveling UP.

- ❖ UP...because Jerusalem was built on a hill.
- ❖ UP...because this was a trip full of prayer and worship.
- ❖ UP...because they were about to dwell with God, for the temple was in Jerusalem.
- ❖ On their Jerusalem journey, God's people believed they were traveling UP—above the mundane things of life, above the struggles, above the difficulties—UP to a Jerusalem experience!

CARES Act

The CARES Act that became law on March 27, 2020 included provisions that affect individual's Charitable Contribution Deductions and changes to retirement plans. The FOC Board of Directors wanted to make you aware of these changes.

Charitable Contributions

- Individuals who do **not** itemize deductions may claim a charitable contribution of up to \$300.00 for the taxable year for cash contributions made to a public charity.
- For individuals who itemize, the Act expands the limit on deductibility of cash contributions made to a public charity during 2020 to 100% of adjusted gross income.
- For corporations that itemize, the Act has increased the charitable deduction to 25% of the taxpayer's taxable income.

Retirement Plans

- For 2020, the Act waives the required minimum distributions (RMDs) from qualified retirement plans and IRAs.
- For 2020, the Act waives the 10% early withdrawal penalty for coronavirus-related (certain criteria must be met) withdrawals up to \$100,000.00 from retirement plans. Withdrawals are subject to income tax with an election to ratably spread the income over a 3-year period.

The above information is provided solely for informational purposes. If you are interested in taking advantage of any of these changes, please consult with your legal or tax advisor.

FOC Helping the Community

In response to the pandemic hitting our community, Family of Christ created a special community fund. It is called the FIND (Families In Need) Program.

We ask that you give out of the abundance of God's gifts to you! Every week that this COVID-19 outbreak continues, it places limitations on (and even leads to closures of) workplaces and businesses. Families are and will be in need. Your contributions to this fund should be over and above your regular tithes and offerings to FOC.

Our FIND Program will be utilized to help families get food, supplies, and medicine in addition to meeting other living expenses. Our initial focus will be purchasing King Soopers gift cards for families in need.

The funds will be administered by Pastor Moreno and our *Head Elder*, John Harris. If you would like to contribute, please make sure you designate that your donation is for the "FIND Program."
